Children and vulnerable adults are assessed for safety. Referrals to appropriate services are made. Legal intervention may be necessary to ensure safety. Services are provided to these families to help ameliorate the problems, which led to the legal intervention.

Family Preservation services are provided to some families that have been determined to be of high risk after an investigation has been conducted.

Home studies are conducted for families that are interested in becoming foster parents or adoptive parents. Children available for placement have been through the Protective Services System.

Home Care and Attendant Care services are provided for elderly or disabled that are aimed at preventing institutionalization and are at risk of neglect or exploitation. Eligibility is based on income and need.

Reductions in angry, anxiety and self-defeating and ending violent behaviors are also therapeutic goals. Services include case management, education, client empowerment, limited transitional living, emergency housing and advocacy. Daybreak Center works with all age groups and both genders. Preventing Abuse Re-Enactment (PARE) Program is a treatment program for adolescent and child sex offenders. Ages served for the PARE Program are 8-17. The focus is to provide early intervention and to stop inappropriate sexual behaviors by youthful offenders toward others.

DAY TREATMENT: A collaborative effort between Halvorson House and Farmington Public School to provide supportive educational and therapeutic services to students and their families during the afternoon and early evening hours. The services coordinate an intensive set of individualized therapeutic family, group, individual services which assist the youth and family to remove obstacles that interfere with the students ability to attend school, stay on task and function responsibly; assist the family in parenting skill development and boundary setting to provide them with resources to encourage and motive their children; and engage the community to assist in external supports which promote responsible behavior.

JUVENILE DRUG COURT: To provide an intense court monitored probation program to rehabilitate non-violent juvenile offenders who abuse drugs and/or alcohol. Youth receive group and individual counseling, substance abuse assessments, and family counseling. This program is funded through the Eleventh Judicial District Court.

LIFE SKILLS PROGRAM:

A series of structured group sessions on related topics i.e. child development, anger and stress management, nutrition, conflict resolution, safety, substance abuse, decision making skills, budgeting, job search skills, social skills, consumer skills, goal development, health/exercise immunization, AIDS, legal issues, sexuality, self-defense, peer pressure, gang related issues, domestic violence, and violence prevention. Halvorson House provides a lifeskills curriculum that has been approved by The Children Youth and Families Department.

1. Independent Living Specialist (ILS) is a person who supports people with disabilities toward the independent lifestyle of their choice.
2. The Procurement Program is designed to assist consumers in acquiring/purchasing home modifications or assistive devices that will assist them in living a more independent life.
3. The Consumer Directed Personal Care Option is an attendant service that helps people with disabilities live independently as possible at home.
4. Traumatic Brain Injury Coach offers a variety of community-based services to people who have sustained traumatic brain injuries or are recovering from brain injuries. These life skills services are available to both brain injury survivors and family members.
5. Benefits Planning, Assistance, and Outreach (BPA&O). This service includes management of consumers' benefit packages such as Section 8 Housing, General Assistance, SSI/SSDI and usage of SS work incentives.
6. Shiprock Elder Care Program is an Adult Day Care Service Program for frail, older persons which should enable them to remain independent in their home environment, and to delay or avoid institutionalization in San Juan County and the Navajo Nation of the State of New Mexico.

SERVICES PROVIDED

Teen Court gives First Offender teens an opportunity to take part in a court room situation and have their case heard before a jury of peers where a sentence is decided upon and handed down. A teen attorney is assigned to represent and prosecute each case. The defendant then is expected to complete his/her sentence which may include Community Service, serving on subsequent Teen Court juries, restitution, classes, letters of apology, etc.

The First Offender Program consists of 16 hours of group learning and discussions and 6 hours of hands on problem solving and bonding activities. This group is also for a First Offender Child and his/her parents and meets once a week for eight weeks, with the workshop being held on a Saturday. Topic of discussion includes, peer pressure, anger management, pro-activity, wise decision-making, problem solving, communication and other life skills that will help the child learn not to re-offend.
